Early Communication Matters 1-day Training

This training was developed and is co-delivered with a speech and language specialist.

Training Aims:

The training will support practitioners working in any kind of setting to:

- recognise and support typical language development (pre-verbal and verbal)
 - understand why children might have difficulty listening, and know how to help
 - support families to enhance children's language and development at home
 - understand how singing and play relate to language development
 - recognise when a child doesn't understand language
 - know when to refer children for Speech and Language Therapy.
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Who is the training for: Early years, school or family support practitioners
